#### Steve Wells Biography

I served in the Army National Guard from 1988-1994. I rode bulls in local and professional rodeos from 1993-2001 competing in roughly 100 rodeos per year. I qualified for the PRCA Great Lakes Circuit Finals in 2000 making me one of the top 12 bull riders in the Midwest. My 3 kids have all taken up the rodeo passion in different events. After several injuries and starting a family, I transitioned to full time farrier work. I've been doing that the last 21 to 22 years. I grew up a hunter and fisherman and knives were always a big interest to me so my forging and farrier work morphed into blade smithing as a hobby and now it's a part of my business. Forging horseshoes didn't excite me, but I found I love forging and creating knives. I now split my time between farrier work, and blade smithing. I competed on Forged in Fire in 2019 (Season 7) and 2021 (Season 8). It was a great experience even though I didn't win. It made me better and more passionate about blade smithing. It's been a constant learning experience and I think I will be making knives as long as I am able.
